	G. What percentage of fault, if any, was assigned to the plaintiff?	(Enter percentage)	If the plaintiff was partly at fault, the total verdict (previous question) should reflect the amount for which the defendants are liable. If the plaintiff was not held to be at fault, enter 0.
	H. If the plaintiff obtained a verdict against more than one defendant, was liability joint and several, or separate?	(Enter 1 if joint and several liability, or 2 if separate liability for each defendant)	If liability is joint and several, skip to question 8.K.

J. How was the verdict divided among the following categories of damages?

The sum of 8.J.1-3 must equal the total reported in 8.F. Enter "\$0" if no damages of a particular type were awarded by the jury.

1 Economic compensatory damages (Enter dollar amount)

Enter amount of economic damages (sometimes called "special damages") awarded by jury without any adjustments

2 Non-economic compensatory damages (Enter dollar amount)

Enter amount of non-economic compensatory damages (sometimes called "general damages") awarded by jury without any adjustments

3 Punitive damages (Enter dollar amount)

Enter amount of punitive damages (sometimes called "exemplary damages") awarded by jury without any adjustments

4 Enter the amount, if any, of pre-judgment interest awarded by the court. (Enter dollar amount)

Enter "\$0" only if no pre-judgment interest was awarded.

Questions 8.K-L only apply to cases tried to a jury. For cases tried to a judge, skip to question 8.M

K. If the court reduced the damage award (Enter dollar amount; enter "\$0" if (whether because of a cap on damages appropriate.) or remittitur or any other reason) enter the amount by which the award was reduced

Enter the amount, if any, by which the court reduced the jury verdict as a result of a cap on damages or interest or because of remittitur. Enter \$0 if no reduction was imposed.

L. If the court increased the damage award (additur), enter the total increase (Enter dollar amount; enter "\$0" if appropriate.)

Enter the amount, if any, by which the court increased the jury verdict as a result of additur. Do not report pre-judgment interest on this line. Enter \$0 if there was no additur.

M. Enter the total judgment awarded by the court, including pre-judgment interest, after any adjustment due to damage caps, remittitur, or additur.

(Enter dollar amount; enter "\$0" if appropriate.)

Must equal 8.F (awarded damages) + 8.J4 (prejudgment interest) - 8.K (effect of damage caps and remittitur) + 8.L (additur).
